'Come and See'

The Christian life is a calling from God to be companions of Jesus and work for the spread of his love and justice. All of us are asked to do this in our own lives. A common question we ask when we meet someone is where they live. It says something about them, gives us a clue how to find them. The disciples were the same with Jesus. After a short meeting with him, they wanted to know where to find him again. More than just telling him, he invited them to his home, and brought them there. They liked it and stayed for the day.

But there is more to it: the question in John's gospel is about where do you live in yourself? What is deepest to you? The 'all day' was that they would stay with him as disciples, always.

Something about Jesus attracted them and made them want to stay. We may ask the same of him, and we know from other things where his home is. 'We will make our home in you' is what Jesus later said. When we want to find him, we should look for him in each other. The gift of faith that stems from his love for us is nourished when we share that faith. It is also nourished when we share love in the ordinary relationships of our life and when we care for the poor and needy.
