Confessions for Easter 2021: Amidst these difficult and extraordinary times when we are unable to gather together to celebrate the great feasts of Holy Week and Easter, our obligation to go to Confession and receive Holy Communion, is removed from us. Instead, we can make an Act Of Perfect Contrition to express our deep sorrow for our sins against the goodness of God. People who cannot get to confession because of the coronavirus lockdown can go to God directly, requesting pardon and experience God's loving forgiveness. "God welcomes every repentant sinner with open arms". The Pope says, "It's like going home. Do what the Catechism says: It is very clear: If you cannot find a priest to confess to, speak directly with God, your Father, and tell him the truth. Say, 'Lord, I did this, this. Forgive me,' and ask for pardon with all your heart." Make an act of contrition, and promise God, "I will go to confession afterwards, but forgive me now.' And immediately you will return to a state of grace with God."

Reflection - Death of the Good Shepherd

Jesus said: 'I am the good shepherd; the good shepherd lays down his life for his sheep.' Jesus did not have to suffer and die. He had a choice. He chose to suffer and die because he cared about the flock God had entrusted to him. What Jesus wants from us is not our suffering, but a life of love and service. Such a life will inevitably bring suffering. But Jesus supports all those who follow him down the road of faithful love and generous service.
