In the Church we have different views on many issues like ordination, abortion, sexuality. But we need to continue our commitment to what the church has been good at for years — care for life, for the poor, the homeless and the refugee.

Jairus' little girl was a not a lost cause. Neither is the Church. Our future is in prayer, in sharing faith together, and living the gospel of Jesus in word and in how we live.
